COVID-19 Policy for the Luncheon

Your health and safety matter

We are hosting this event in coordination with the policies and procedures established by the CDC and the local government. Prior to the luncheon

If you feel unwell or experience COVID-related symptoms in the seven days prior to the luncheon, you should not attend, regardless of any test results. If a member of your household is unwell, is experiencing COVID-related symptoms, or currently has COVID, you should not attend, regardless of any test results.

Masking and other physical distancing measures

As of May 1, 2022 the CDC's current COVID-19 Community Level for Cuyahoga County (Cleveland's county) has been designated as LOW. In accordance with CDC guidelines, no masking or other physical distancing measures will be required during the conference. If the CDC designation for Cuyahoga County remains at LOW or MEDIUM on Monday, June 6, masking will remain optional. If the designation moves to high, conference participants will be informed, and masking policies will change. If you would like to wear a mask during the Keeping the Promise event, you are welcome to do so.
